### **Attendance and Punctuality**



Regular attendance is linked directly to raising achievement and it will help to give your child the best possible start in life if you can encourage good attendance routines from an early age.

The minimum satisfactory attendance for pupils at Harlow Green is 96% but most children should routinely have attendance rates of 97% or more. Many children at our school do in fact achieve 100% attendance either over a term or for the whole school year and this achievement is recognised. We will track absence over the year and follow the school policy to tackle persistent absence. Please ensure your child is in the playground by 8:50am when the school bell rings.

Holidays during term time are not considered to be an exceptional circumstance and will not be authorised. Where children of statutory school age are taken out of school for a holiday during term-time for 5 days or more this will be referred to the local authority for consideration of a fixed penalty notice.



All children in school have two PE lessons per week and children should now have a labelled PE kit in school. This should be brought in at the start of each half term and then school will send it home to be washed at the end of the half term. This means that it does not matter what day PE lessons are on, children will always be prepared and take part. For health and safety reasons, earrings should not be worn for PE or swimming.

# Nursery – Welcome Back



We have been welcoming back our returning children who have been eager to catch up and share news about their holidays with their friends. Upon their return, the children were very excited to find lots of new furniture and resources at Nursery and have enjoyed exploring and playing with the new toys.

We have also welcomed some new children to our Nursery who have been visiting with parents and getting used to staying at Nursery on their own. It has been lovely to see the returning children helping them to settle in and make new friends.

Reception – Getting to know each other



We are so proud of how our Reception children have settled into school especially as their first full weeks have been very busy! The children have had fun both indoors and outdoors and have enjoyed climbing on the adventure playground and exploring the different areas in the classroom.

Staff have been greatly impressed at how the children have proudly shared their summer holiday books, recounting their adventures with new friends. It has also been really nice to see that all the children are really enjoying their Read, Write Inc lessons where they are developing their knowledge and use of phonics.



This term, Year 1 have been going dinosaur crazy! To begin with, the children searched the school grounds to find as many different types of dinosaur as they could. They then made dinosaur headbands to help them act out the story of 'Tyrannosaurus Drip'. In addition, the children have been learning about the job of a palaeontologist and have been hunting for fossils. This has led to children enjoying using clay to make their own fossils!



In Geography, the Year 2 children have been hunting the school grounds for map symbols. They have also been learning about compass directions and practising their compass skills by directing a friend around a map. The children are all looking forward to creating their own map and applying their learning of map skills and compass directions.

# Year 3 – Place Value Puzzles



In Year 3, the children have been exploring different representations of 3-digit numbers. The boys and girls made 3-digit numbers using counters and solved puzzles involving making the same number in different ways. Children were also beginning to write a calculation to show the number they had made.

# Year 4 – Exciting Electricity

During Science lessons, Year 4 have been learning about how electricity is made and used, and presented these facts to the class. They then looked at how electricity travels around a circuit and made their own circuits using different components. They were amazed when they could make a bulb light using just kitchen foil and a battery!

### Year 5 – Learning about the 3 'R's



As part of their new start in Year 5, the children have been exploring ideas surrounding the three 'R's: Rights, Responsibilities and Rules. They thought about what the world, our country, our home and school might be like if there were no three 'R's. They then pictured their school and home and drew a scene to depict this.



Year 6 had a very special visitor this month from the RAF to launch their 'Peacekeepers' topic. Corporal Michael Galvin came to talk to the children about his experiences and why he had signed up for the role. The children enjoyed asking questions and handling some different items from Corporal Galvin's working life. They were amazed to find out that fighter jets can fly from Scotland to London in just fifteen minutes! Thank you to Corporal Galvin for his time.
