The children competed against 48 other schools in a range of track and field events. As a team, they achieved some fantastic results as well as showing maturity and commitment in their events.

In respect of successes we had:

- 9 individuals or teams that won their heats, which then meant progressing into the semi-finals
- 2 sprinters who made it into the finals of their events
- the Year 4 sprinters placed 2nd and 4th in the 50m and 60m races
- an incredible Year 6 thrower (who almost beat the record!) throwing a fantastic 31m to place first and win the gold medal

# Year 4 – World Transplant Games Workshop



Mrs Blinkhorn and Mrs Old's class were very lucky to have two sets of visitors on Friday in relation to the World Transplant games that are going to be held in the region this summer. During the morning session, the class learned about the important work regarding organ donation. In the afternoon, two local artists worked with the class to plan their ideas for printing a poster about organ donation. The class discovered a lot about the different organs that can be transplanted and enjoyed using different artistic techniques.

#### Year 5 - Oriental Museum Visit



Year 5 had the opportunity to visit the Oriental Museum in Durham, to consolidate their learning about the ancient city of Baghdad and their RE work regarding Islam. The classes began the visit by studying various rare artefacts from C.900. They then worked in pairs to search for answers to questions about the period before chosing one artefact each to study in more depth.

To complement their DT work about Islamic patterns, the children worked collaboratively to design a pattern on a ceramic tile. Everyone was challenged to make sure the patterns on the tiles fitted together! Later colour was added which meant they were ready to be baked in the oven at home.

After lunch, the boys and girls enjoyed working in a group to produce algorithms using a movable toy. Finally, the children performed some of the stories from 1001 Arabian Nights having great fun using props and costumes to tell the stories.

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#### Year 6 – Residential Experience

Year 6 enjoyed a trip to the Roman fort of Vindolanda. They were able to explore the ruins and discover what the different buildings had been used for. It was interesting to see a real archaeological dig taking place, where the first pair of Roman boxing gloves has been discovered. The children then enjoyed the opportunity to see artefacts in the museum and watch a 3D movie about life in the fort at the time.
