

For your home learning you can choose from the following tasks. You must do the task in the centre first. You can do the other tasks in any order. Please upload anything you discover to Tapestry.

Physical Development

Fine Motor Skills

Write your name in bubble writing. Fill it with lots of collage or colours. Cut up your own bits of paper and add, or fill with drawings of your favourite things. Cut out your name letter by letter and make a sign. Hang it anywhere you want

Gross Motor Skills

Make an obstacle course either inside your house or outside in the garden. What can you travel under, over and through? Time yourself to complete the challenge with a grown up. Can you make your time faster? What's your best time? Can you make your obstacle course longer with more challenges?

Communication and Language

Make a feely bag full of different things. Sit in a circle with your family. Take turns to describe what the items is without saying the name. Try your best to use lots of different describing words.

Mathematics

Chose a favourite meal and ask a grown up to help you make it. Can you be in charge of measuring? Can you make sure you have the correct amount of everything? Record amounts of what you use.

Literacy

Write or draw a recount of what you have been doing with your time off school. We would love to see some labels if you draw it!
