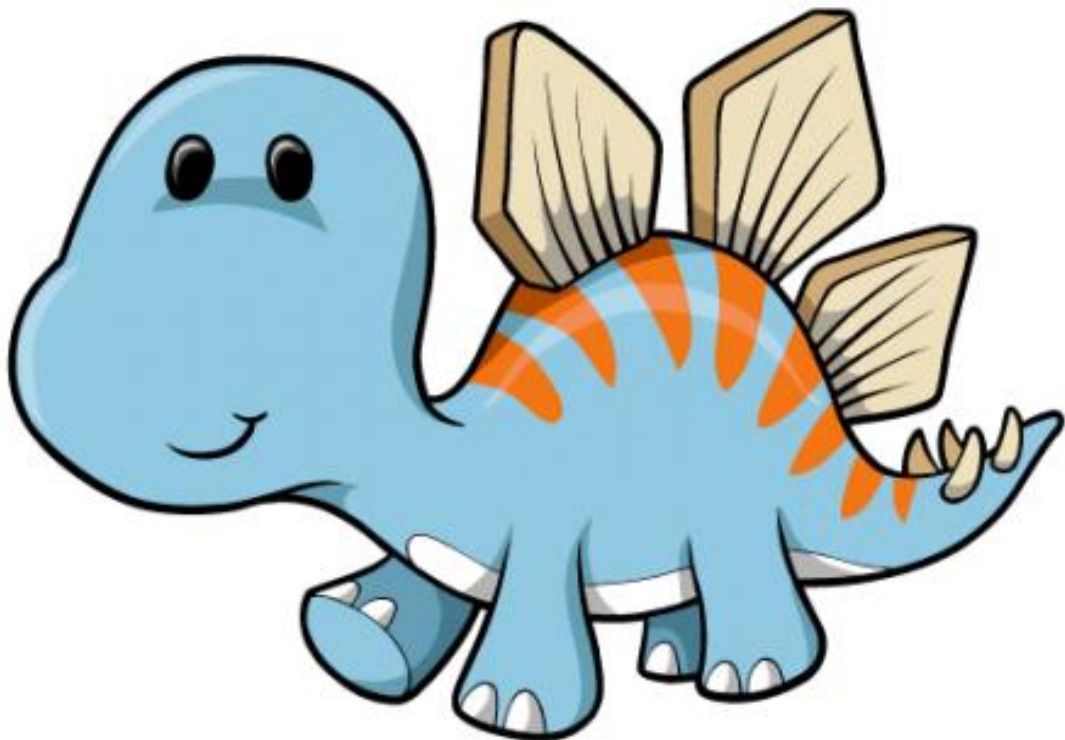

Watch and join in with Joe Wicks (The Body Coach).

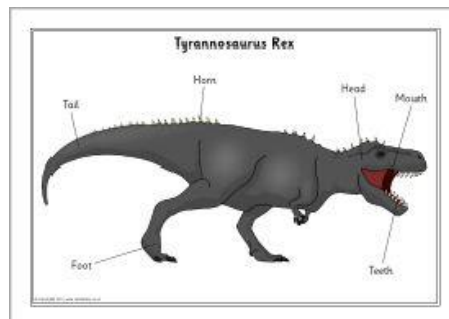

Write a story about a story about a dinosaur who comes to your house for tea.

What will they eat?

What will they destroy?
