Topic Title: There's No Place Like Home.....



For your home learning you can choose from the following tasks. You must do the task in the centre first. You can do the other tasks in any order. Most of all have fun - we know that you are going to be at home a lot, so these might help you keep busy, enjoy time at home and of

<u>Science</u>: Sounds; using paper or plastic cups and some string, make yourself a telephone! Pass messages to each other through it. Does it work round the corner, in the hall, on the stairs or can you even play music or sing?!

Using a pencil and some paper do a sketch drawing of someone's ear, or your own from a picture. Shade it as we have learnt in art. Can you remember the parts, and name them? Maybe even watch a video guide on drawing ears to help.

Finally - why not make your own orchestra? What different things in the house make noise? Can you create a tune?!

<u>History</u>: The Vikings. Create a Fact File about the Vikings; Put your Viking in the middle and come up with as many facts as you can about them; their lives, houses, food, tools, battles, armies and places they lived. Can you find any place names in the UK that have Viking heritage?

English: Write a post card, email or letter about what you've been learning and doing and show off your English skills!
Conjunctions, clauses, fronted-adverbials and amazing vocabulary! (Make sure you have stamps and can post them if you have to stay at home.)

Art: Create a landscape image. You can use crayons, pencils, fabric, paper, collage, or if you have access to a computer or tablet, draw a picture on the computer.

There's No Place Like Home.....

Start by making a picture of where you call home. You can use anything; painting, drawing, collage, sketching, using colours, lead pencils etc. Draw it when you are at home. Label it with all the things that make it home to you!

<u>D.T.</u>: Viking Ships - We would like you to design and construct a Viking Longboat using anything you can find at home. Junk, rubbish, spare card, cut out catalogues for sails, straws etc etc. If you succeed, bring it back to school when you can and we will try sailing it!

<u>Science - Electricity</u>. Design and make a poster about staying safe around electricity at home to tell others or younger family members about being careful and safe? OR film a VLOG on a tablet or telephone giving advice about staying safe at home and show it to people at home.

<u>Maths</u>: the best way to learn about maths is to use maths!

- Tell the time, read a clock, look at a timetable, days, weeks, months and seconds, minutes hours.
- Count the coins up and work out change, totals and compare amounts of money.
- -Measure, weigh, fill, pour using jugs, scales and reading and understanding labels.
