Topic Title: Peacekeepers



For your home learning you can choose from the following tasks. **You must do the task in the centre first.** You can do the other tasks in any order.

Find out about dance moves from the 1930s and 40s and create your own dance routine. Think back to the Jitterbug and the Jive for inspiration. Listen to Bill Haley for some musical accompaniment and show your friends your moves!

Design a propaganda poster to encourage people to join in with the war effort. You could include topics such as women at work, 'Make Do and Mend' and 'Dig for Victory'. Remember to use persuasive language.

Make an Anderson Shelter using materials you have at home. Take a photo and annotate it to show the materials you have used.

Research which foods were rationed in World War Two. Make a wartime menu using only rationed foods for a family of 4. Try and make your meals as nutritionally balanced as possible.

Peacekeepers

Imagine you were a child evacuated in World War Two. Write a series of diary entries to show your feelings as you embark on this emotional journey. You could write about leaving the city, your train journey to the countryside and meeting your new family.

Think about layout and punctuation. Try and show your Year 6 skills (paragraphs, subheadings, vocabulary)

Free Choice: choose something you would like to do about our topic and write about it here.

Research statistics from World War Two. Put this data in a graph to show a topic of your choice such as numbers of evacuees, deaths over time or soldiers enrollment in the army.

Research World War Two vehicles such as fighter planes or tanks. Make a model of the vehicle out of anything you can find. Get creative!

Make shadows using lights. Try to get creative with the shapes you make and take photos if you can.

Re-create your Sukkah hut using materials you find around the house. Remember to only build 3 walls and you should be able to see the sky through the roof. Decorate the inside to reflect a traditional Jewish celebration.
